## New Automated Gates

We are really excited to tell you that we have had new automated school gates installed. These will ensure that our learners remain safe whilst at school and mean that our perimeters are really secure. This was a huge project to implement – a very big thank you to everyone involved for their efforts!





## Winter's here!

Please make sure your young person comes to school equipped for the colder weather including gloves or mittens, scarves and hats. Please ensure all items are named as we cannot guarantee to be able to locate them again if they are lost and unnamed.



Whilst on the subject of colder days, please make sure you are fully aware of the procedure for school closure in the event of snow or other extreme weather conditions. If we need to close the school due to severe weather, we will:-

- Inform local radio stations (BBC Radio Berkshire, Heart, Reading 107);
- Update our website and school answerphone message;
- Inform the Local Authority school transport service;
- Send a message via Schoolcomms after 7am on the morning of the closure. Please check you are registered for this service, especially if you have changed your mobile telephone number. Speak to the school office if unsure.

Judgements about whether to close the school are based on Met Office forecasts including the likelihood of worsening weather throughout the day and include a number of factors. If the school is open in the morning but the weather begins to deteriorate throughout the school day, we may have to make the decision to send your young person home early. In this event, the school will contact you via Schoolcomms where appropriate and will contact the local authority transport teams to facilitate early pick-ups. In extreme circumstances it may be necessary for you to facilitate the pick-up of your young person.

**Opal inclusion class**- when a decision to close is made this also applies to those Kennel Lane learners in the inclusion class, which is based at Birch Hill Monday to Thursday, even if the Birch Hill site is still open.

Finally, please note that due to learners arriving by taxi and the vulnerability of some of our learners, it may be necessary to close the school site **even if other schools in the area remain open** in order to keep everyone safe. We will endeavour to remain open as far as we can, but our first priority must be with our learner's safety and your understanding in this matter is appreciated.
