First/Next /Then boards

- Encourage the learner to hold their board whilst transitioning, if not appropriate, take the symbol off the visual support, making the transition as independent as possible. the board, label it and give it to the student to hold 'Time for.....' this is so the learner can always see
- have completed off or the adult modelling. 'Soft play has finished, now it's....' Always ensure the learner gets to the end of their board, either the learner taking the symbol they
- adult as this is being done so they can see it happening. When the last symbol is taken off, a new board can be made. The learner should always be with the
- If a learner walks in a different direction, refer them back to the board/symbol. 'We're walking to.....'

Next steps-

- The learner should be encouraged to collect their board for transitions. A 'check your timetable' prompt might be used where appropriate.
- Some learners will be able to go to their individual timetable in the classroom, and with a prompt, transfer the next 3 symbols onto their First/next/then board for transitions.
