Academic – Members from the centralised team at Corvus Learning Trust came to see how we teach reading at KLS, mainly in Secondary. We received the following positive feedback:

'The successes of the delivery and structured teaching of reading were evident throughout our drop ins and especially so in KS3, KS4 and KS5 where all learners were thoroughly engaged with their learning, thriving from the structured approach to the lesson with the routines they had adopted overtime with the coordinated teaching of RWI.'

Life Skills – Key Stage 2 are benefitting from accessing the main Cookery Room on a rotational basis, so far groups of learners have made pizzas.

Employability – Year 11 working experience starts next week for some of our young people and lots of placements have been organised which match our 14-19 pathways. As part of their 14-19 option choices our learners can choose from the following pathways Creative, Hospitality, IT and Outdoor Learning.

This is when we begin our preparations for our productions. 


Elizabeth has been working really hard in her Speech and Language Therapy sessions, using her communication book and Colourful Semantics. Well done, Elizabeth!
